We're excited to be able to take them around this magnificent city!



Potential Hazard	Possible Likelihood and/or Seriousness of Injury	Control Measures To Be Put In Place	Assessment of Remaining Risk
Traffic	Possible and potentially very serious.	Supervision of children by class teachers and parents.	Still a risk
Pavement, steps and road conditions due to weather or repair	Likely and could be serious.	Children asked to wear appropriate shoes for walking Supervision of children by school staff.	Still a risk
Child wandering away from group	Possible and potentially very serious.	Supervision of children by school staff and parents.  Clear information to children to remain in class line and not to leave group. This should be given by teacher before the tour starts.	Still a risk
Needles/broke n glass in Greyfriars	Possible and potentially very serious.	Supervision of children by school staff and parents. Clear information not to touch anything on the ground and to stay with the group at all times.	Still a risk.
Tetanus from rusty metal around the mortsafe	Possible and potentially very serious.	Pupils to be told not to touch mortsafe and to clean hands with sterile wipes (teachers first aid kits should have these).	Still a risk.

Location	Notes
Meeting place at Museum of Scotland	Please 'toilet' and 'snack' the pupils before the tour starts. We will be visiting the Museum and your guide will complete a Museum booking form for you. This should allow your class to use the toilets in the ground floor section of the Museum.
Museum of Scotland	Look at outfits of the mid-eighteenth century, especially the women's dresses.  Class will use the stairs. There is a lift which can be used if needed.
Potterrow Port	Walk up South College Wynd and stop next to Potterrow Port underpass.
Cross over South Bridge	PUSH BE76ho com
Walk to Drummond Street and then along to the	Pupils will cross two quiet roads. Note - there is no pedestrian crossing here. There is no
Pleasance	alternative option here. PSA/Parent helpers/Teacher to assist.

Walk down the Pleasance and cross Holyrood Road.	
Walk up St Mary's Street and then to the High Street.	This is a busy street.
Cross over Blackfriars Street	Note - there is no pedestrian crossing here. There is no alternative option here. PSA/Parent helpers/Teacher to assist.
Cross over South Bridge.	
Walk up the High Street.	This is a pedestrianised area.

Mercat Cross	Very busy area, PSA/Parent helper/Teacher to ensure children are all accounted for.
Parliament Square	Very busy area, PSA/Parent helper/Teacher to ensure children are all accounted for.
Crossing from George IV Bridge to David Hume statue.	This is a small pedestrian crossing.
